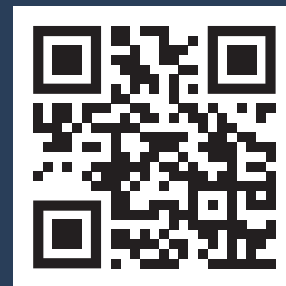

Traffickers use false promises of good jobs or even love to deceive and entice their victims. Once recruited, victims are forced to engage in labor or commercial sex through threats, debt bondage, and other severe forms of abuse.

By knowing what human trafficking is, what signs to look for, and whom to contact for help, you can play an important role in identifying and supporting victims in Utah.
