The Utah Asian Festival works closely with the Utah State Fairpark to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all our patrons. Every person entering the festival grounds is subject to physical inspection by security personnel.

Bags larger than and including 11" x 17" will be inspected upon entry. Diaper bags, personal health items, strollers, and wheelchairs are exempt from inspection.

Anyone not agreeing to this search will be restricted from entering the festival.

These items **ARE NOT** allowed into the festival grounds:

- **NO** knives or weapons of any kind
- **NO** pets
- **NO** artificial noisemakers
- **NO** coolers (except for guests with medical needs)
- **NO** smoking
- **NO** beach balls
- **NO** missile-like objects of any kind (including frisbees, footballs, etc.)
- **NO** objects that obstruct other guests' view, including umbrellas, signs, or flags larger than 3' x 2'
- **NO** laser pointers
- **NO** aerosol containers (including aerosol sunscreen)
- **NO** poles or sticks of any kind, including selfie-sticks
- **NO** bikes, scooters, or other large personal items
- **NO** drones
- **NO** promotional items with commercial slogans or identification without written consent from the Utah Asian Festival

This event may contain loud, continuous noises.

Please note: Utah Asian Festival attendees must comply with all Utah Asian Festival health and safety guidelines and any other local or municipal health and safety guidelines, laws, rules, and regulations. Any item or action deemed dangerous or inappropriate by management will not be allowed in and around the festival. Confiscated items will be disposed of and not returned. Items left in vehicles should be stored out of sight, management is not responsible for lost or stolen property of any kind.

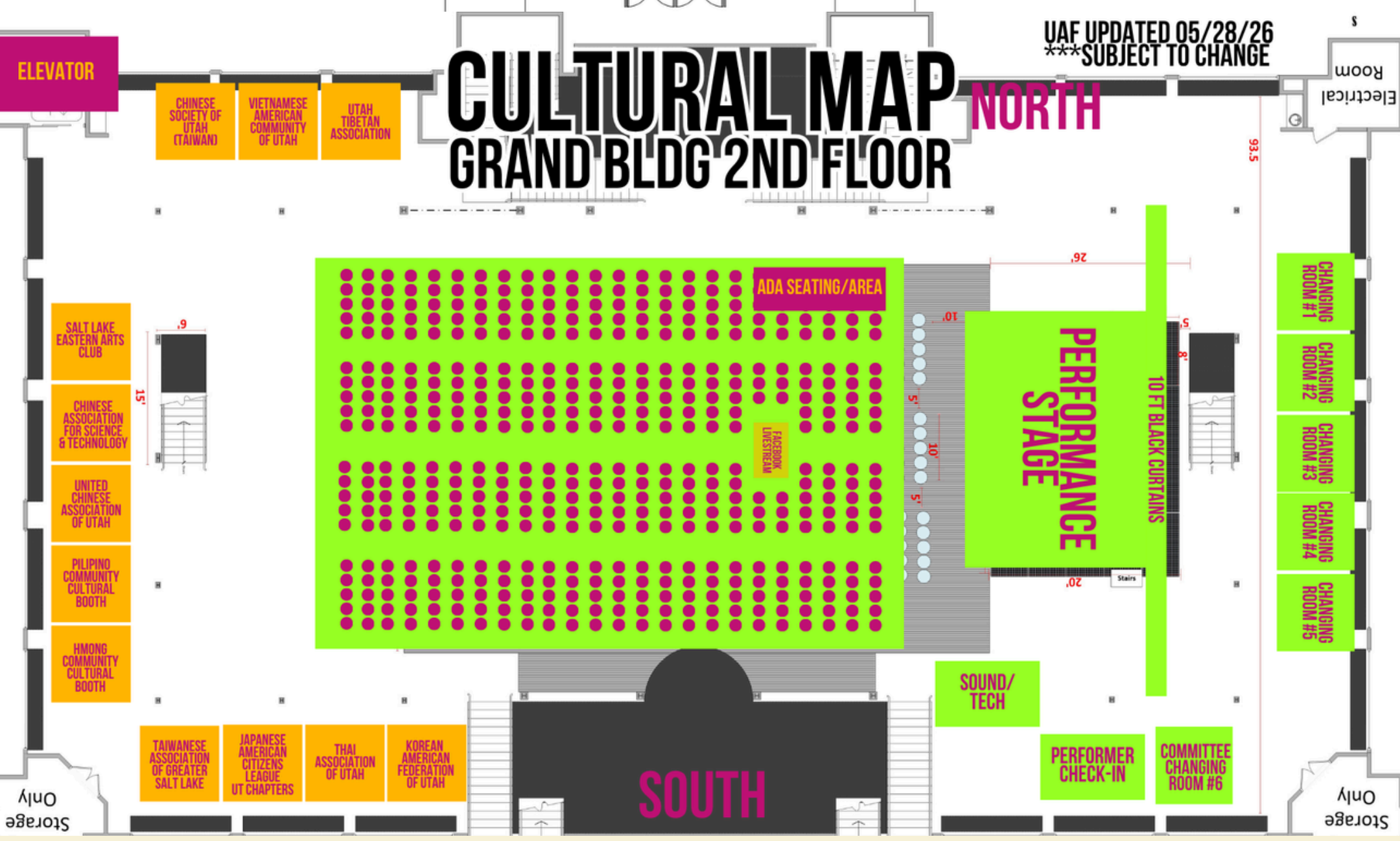
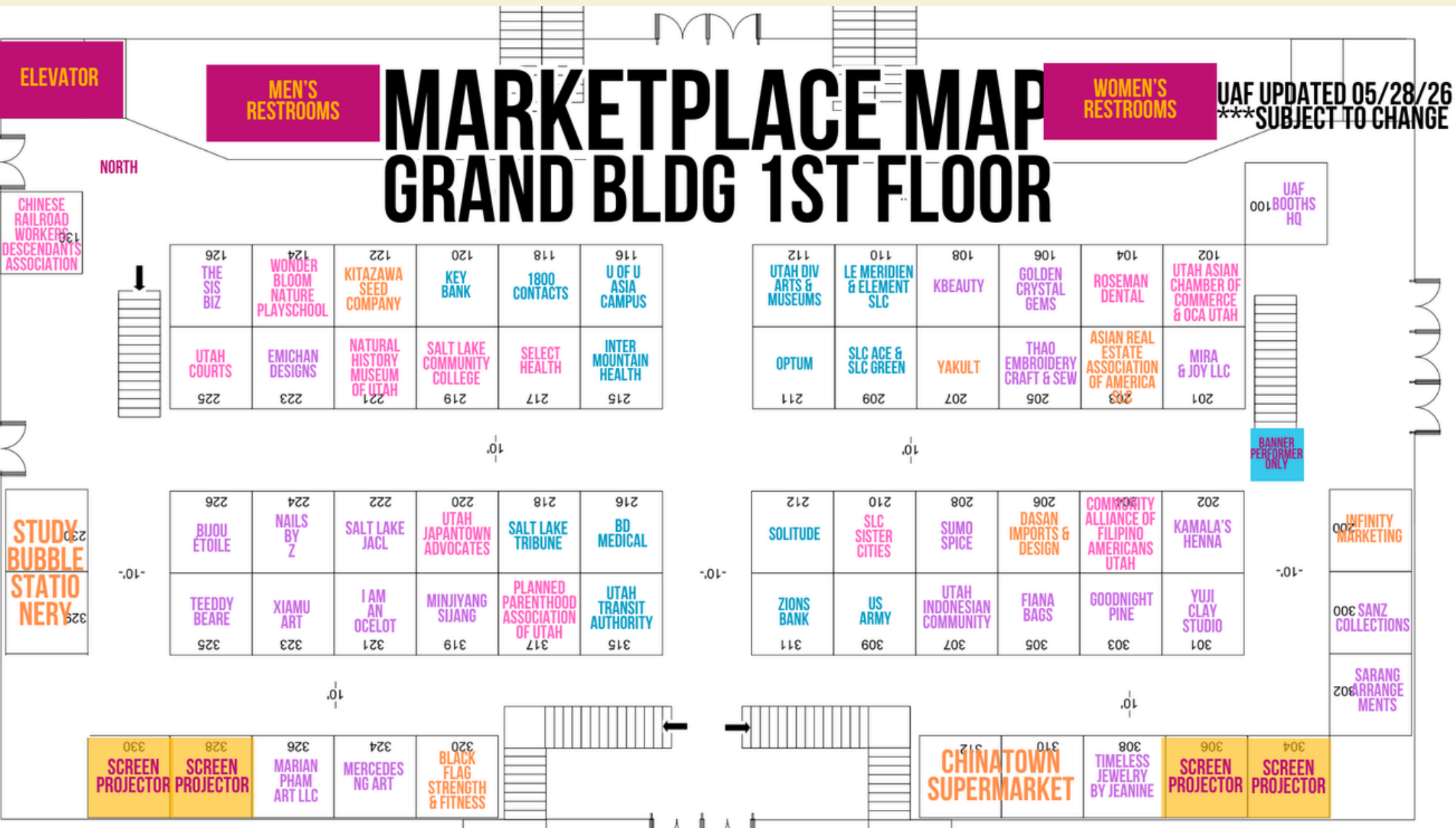
How to Have the Best day

ABOUT THE ASIAN ASSOCIATION OF UTAH

Our community is a unique intersection of two groups: Asian Americans in Utah--representing our heritage community--and marginalized refugees, asylum seekers, and human trafficking victims--representing the community we serve.

We work to help victims of human trafficking, refugees, and refugee youth improve, become self-sufficient, and thrive. Our work is trauma-informed and linguistically sensitive, delivered by specialized staff who journey with each individual and family as they transition to life in Utah.

In 1978, the Asian Association of Utah board of directors and Asian community leaders hosted the inaugural Utah Asian Festival at the Salt Palace demonstrating unity in our community and showcasing the wealth of traditions and culture of our Asian American communities through performances, exhibits, and food.

The festival was the answer to the board of directors' goals 1) to unify our diverse Asian American communities consisting of historical ethnic groups (Chinese, Filipino, Japanese, Korean) in Utah with our new, incoming refugee populations as a result of the wars in Southeast Asia (Hmong, Khmer, Laotian, Vietnamese); 2) to uplift our communities on a statewide platform; and 3) to educate the general public about the diversity, experiences, history, and contributions of Asian Americans in Utah.



HONORING OUR ELDERS & ANCESTORS

From the 49th Utah Asian Festival Planning Committee, we wanted to share our heartfelt appreciation to those who paved the way for our success in hosting the event as we near our 50th anniversary celebration.
